**Darrel S. Brodke, MD** is Professor and Executive Vice Chairman of the Department of Orthopaedics at the University of Utah and holds the Louis S. Peery, MD and Janet B. Peery Presidential Endowed Chair. Dr. Brodke earned his MD at the University of California, San Francisco and completed his Orthopaedic Surgery residency at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He completed a Fellowship in Spine Surgery at the University of Washington, Seattle.

Dr. Brodke has authored or coauthored over 200 publications. He has made numerous presentations nationally and internationally and is the principal investigator on several clinical trials related to the treatment of spinal disorders. He has significant research experience and interests in spinal biomechanics, clinical outcomes in cervical spinal disorders and spinal deformity, and more recently a focus on patient reported outcomes and the PROMIS measures.

Dr. Brodke is the Immediate Past Chair of AO Spine North America and Past President of the Cervical Spine Research Society. He is also on the board of the Lumbar Spine Research Society and a member of the American Orthopaedic Association, Association of Bone & Joint Surgeons, the Scoliosis Research Society, the Little Orthopaedic Association, and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery. He is on the editorial board of CORR and Clinical Spine Surgery, and is a reviewer for Spine, The Spine Journal, Global Spine Journal, Journal of Neurosurgery, Neurosurgery, and CORR.

Darrel Brodke and his wife Anne have 2 children, Dane Brodke, a 2nd year resident in Orthopaedics at UCLA, and Hannah Brodke, a Physical Therapist who just graduated from PT school at Wash U in St Louis after completing her undergraduate degree at Washington University.
